Re: Pre-Petition Claims Missing Personal Representative Documentation

Dear Counsel:

On July 31, 2008, the ACandS Asbestos Settlement Trust ("ACandS Trust" or the "Trust") was created as a result of a Confirmation Order entered by the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Delaware in the Case of In re: ACandS, Inc., Case No. 02-12687 (JKF). Pursuant to the Trust Distribution Procedures, which were approved as part of the Plan of Reorganization by the Bankruptcy Court, the ACandS Trust was directed to make certain payments to identified holders of Pre-Petition Liquidated Claims. The ACandS Trust has resolved the vast majority of the Pre-Petition Liquidated Claims, and the Trust is now preparing to conclude the Pre-Petition Claims Program.


As you may be aware, prior to the Effective Date of the Trust, the Debtor provided the Trust with a certified list of Pre-Petition Claims. It has since come to the Trust's attention that certain claims were not certified as Pre-Petition Claims by the Debtor solely due to missing personal representative documentation. With the consent of the Trust Advisory Committee and the Future Claimants Representative, the Trust has determined that it will review any claims that were denied participation in the Pre-Petition Claims Program solely due to missing personal representative documentation and thus these claims will be considered for payment as a Pre-Petition Claim.

Your law firm has been identified as representing claimants who may have been denied participation in the Pre-Petition Claims Program solely due to missing personal representative documentation. To assist you with curing these deficiencies, I am enclosing a list of your clients who are entitled to submit this missing personal representative paperwork. If you believe you represent additional claimants whose sole deficiency was missing personal representative documentation, please contact the Trust at the above address.

Please note that in order to participate in the Pre-Petition Claims Program, you must contact the Trust by August 22, 2010. **If the Trust does not receive this missing personal representative documentation by August 22, 2010, your clients will waive any right to participate in the Pre-Petition Claims Program.** Please note that if after submitting the personal representative documentation a claim is deficient in any respect, the claim will be denied participation in the Pre-Petition Claims Program.
